



Safehotels Alliance certification is based on “The Global Hotel Security Standard”.
 The maximum score for an audited hotel is 480 points. To reach the passing grade and thereby qualify for a Safehotels Certificate, it is required that the hotel keeps a consistent, high standard including the following equipment and routines;

SAFEHOTELS AUDIT THE FOLLOWING

Certain criteria's are mandatory – such as appropriate fire equipment and training.

To keep the certificate, the hotel has to go through a yearly audit when all equipment is tested, and all records are audited being in good order.

Safehotels Alliance certification system has two levels;



SAFEHOTELS CERTIFICATE

Core Level Certificate is awarded a hotel with the routines and equipment in excellent order. The hotel has to reach 340 points (70%). The Core Level is adjusted to a local market, not necessarily matching the top standard required by an international business hotel.



SAFEHOTELS PREMIUM CERTIFICATE

Premium Level Certificate is awarded a hotel reaching 400 points (about 80%). The hotel has routines and equipment in excellent order. Investments have been made to match the premium standard available in the market. All equipment is in place when it comes to cctv, communication, alarms, sdb etc.
